All students in the course anonymously provided responses to the evaluation. Below are the ratings and illustrative quotations from these evaluations.

Course Evaluation: George Washington University asks students for a numerical “overall rating of the course.” The students’ average rating—on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 being the top rating—was 4.7.
