



## **GLOBAL POLITICS AND MEDIA** **COURSE EVALUATION – SUMMARY**

Spring 2014

Course Number: PLSC 125b / GLBL 353b

All students in the course anonymously provided responses to the evaluation. Below are the ratings and illustrative quotations from these evaluations.

Rating: Yale University asks students for a single numerical rating that reflects the quality of the teaching and course. This question reads: “What is your overall assessment of this course?” The students’ average rating—on a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 meaning “excellent”—was 4.7.

Illustrative quotations: Yale University provides students with the option of responding to each of four qualitative questions. The following are illustrative quotations:

*Overall about the course or instructor:*

- “This was the best course I have taken at Yale.”
- “This was one of the best classes I’ve taken at Yale, if not the best.”
- “One of the best professors I’ve ever had.”
- “Professor Kaufman is really great! Definitely one of the best professors that I’ve had at Yale!”
- “This was one of my favorite courses at Yale, mostly because of Professor Kaufman.”
- “This class was one of my favorites in my time at Yale.”

*More detailed quotations about the course or instructor:*

- “I could tell [Kaufman] had a genuine interest in what we had to say and wanted to make our seminar enjoyable. . . . His class was probably one of the few seminars I’ve come away with feeling like I’ve grown as an academic.”
- “Excellent course! I learned more than I can articulate in this text box, and I’ve left class with a more practical understanding about the intersection of law, media, and politics than I had before.”
- “If there’s a reason to take this class, [Kaufman] would be it. Very engaging person and personable, great towards students.”
